REVERSE BEACON NODE


Our Reverse Beacon Node has been going for a number of weeks now at my place, using my home antenna (horizontal loop, approx. 75m long, at a height of 8m). The CW Skimmer software decodes Morse Code signals and if they are CQ calls they are passed on to the RBN Server for everyone to see.

Calls that are not CQ are filtered out and not passed on, but I've stored all the decoded calls in a log file for 12 days. Analysis of this shows a nice picture of current propagation on the bands.

The attached graph shows the night-time propagation on the 80m band, and also the dropping of during the night of the higher bands. 20m is open all the time now. Please note that the time is in UTC, 12 hours offset from NZ time!

39350 calls were detected and decoded, from 8549 individual stations.

Business as Usual Access to the Emergency Operations Centre ORANGE

Purpose

This policy sets out the processes required to maintain the safety of Marlborough CDEM Group staff, IMT and other groups using the EOC while operating on a day-to-day basis under the COVID-19 Protection Framework, at Orange in the 'traffic light' system.

Exceptions

Fire and Emergency New Zealand, as a tenant of the EOC, has required all staff to work from home. This may change over the coming weeks, with a small number of staff able to work in the office. Delivery couriers enter the building only briefly and are not covered by this policy.

Day-to-day access to the Emergency Operations Centre

EOC staff, IMT and other groups who previously used the EOC for training, meeting, workshops etc may now resume these activities under the below conditions.

Building access

Everyone entering the building is required to sign in and out of the building using the Pad and sanitise their hands on entry. Frequent handwashing and sanitising while on site are essential.

Masks should be worn at all times while also maintaining appropriate distancing where possible

If you are feeling unwell do not enter the EOC

IMT members are required to RAT test prior to attending training nights. There are kits available at the EOC and Council front desk area. Additional test kits will be provided on attendance. As per the "Responding in an Emergency" doc which requires members to test prior to responding

Visitors outside of the above approved groups are not to enter the building beyond the foyer (barrier line). When talking to visitors inside the foyer or outside the building, staff must remain at a 2-metre distance and both parties must be fully masked.
