# INTERNATIONAL LIGHTHOUSE WEEKEND

This event takes place on the weekend of 20/21st August at, for us, Cape Campbell lighthouse.

It is NOT a contest as such, but the aim is to work as many other lighthouse-based stations around the world as possible. Hence it is quite laid-back and casual.

The station has to be operated from the actual lighthouse being activated, therefore we stay overnight in the old lighthouse keepers quarters, which were upgraded some years ago for the film "Light Over the Ocean", and is very comfortable and warm.

When I say "we", there is a hard-core of seasoned members who have taken up the opportunity over several years now, but anyone is invited to join the party, keeping in mind that participants share the cost of the hire of the

lighthouse premises (usually around \$50 each, depending on numbers). We travel by car, leaving Blenheim around 0800 on Saturday and usually return on Sunday afternoon.

If you have not been to Cape Campbell before, this is an ideal opportunity to see a part of the country otherwise only accessible via the foreshore at Marfell's Beach at low tide, unless you have farmer's permission (and a key) to use the road access.

The weather has usually been very kind to us - only once can I remember arriving and putting up antennas in the teeth of a southerly gale and rain.

#### Techoman 1/4 wave whip from Trade Me

This device has the embellished title on Trade Me: TECHOMAN VHF/UHF Complete Mobile Tunable Antenna - RT Radio Telephone Type

After a year I am finally getting my new shack organised and I needed a dedicated antenna for 695. The Ned is a direct line of site from my shack window on the south side of the house so signals are strong. I had been using a mag mount antenna on the desk but its good practice to get the 'RF out of the shack'. Antennas close to power supplies and radios is asking for trouble: hum on transmitted audio is a common result.

The antenna did not need to be dual band for my purpose and the smaller the better. The good old fashioned 1/4 wave whip seemed the way to go. The unit above was bought for \$59.95 plus shared post with other items of \$8.75 shared with a dual band mobile antenna and some multimeter test leads. Delivery took 2 days.

It comes with a 3m length of RG58 terminated in a PL-259 plug. This had to be cut off to get it under the roof tiles and a new plug fitted. Hint, if doing this cut it off with a bit of length, then you can make yourself a coax jumper by fitting a new plug to the off-cut.

The antenna comes with a printed cutting guide for frequencies from 70 to 900 MHz. I discovered this after I had estimated the length from a 300/f and trimmed it a cm at a time with bolt cutters. 1.5 SWR points are about 140 and 148 with a dip of near 1 at 145. I left it like this as it will cover ESB if needed. It has a wide bandwidth, probably a result of being close to the roof on two sides. It came with an allen key for the grub screws and zinc coated self tappers which I used to attach it to the coloursteel spouting. This was what I was after, good value, effective and a short delivery time.
