













PARALLEL KILLERS

CAPE CAMPBELL LIGHTHOUSE WEEKEND – ZL6CC – 19-21 AUGUST 2023

After two years of missing out on ILLW, the first through Covid restrictions and the second because the access road was closed by slips, there was a keen group of participants for the 2023 edition.

The "weekend" is based around UTC so officially starts at midday Saturday till midday Monday and most were able to participate for the full weekend.

A convoy of seven vehicles met at 9am on Saturday, at the turnoff from SH1, under a rather leaden sky with a stiff northerly making it a cool start. We drove out to the lighthouse via the farm road through locked gates and fields of sheep, cattle and chickens, arriving just before 10am.





As the weather was forecast to deteriorate, the first objective was to get our antennas erected and cabled. Our poles, carefully stored in the long grass behind the old henhouse, were recovered and erected along the fence line. As before, we had Rob's (ZL2IW) off-centre fed multi-band dipole on the lawn in front of the accommodation and Bill's (ZL2AYZ) verticals (with raised radials) down at the high-water mark for 20 and 40 metres. We also set up antennas on the verandah for 6M, 2M and 70cm with access to the National system, DMR, and the Ned repeater.



With good teamwork, and spurred on by the approaching showers, we were inside and on the air just after midday. The main HF transceivers were Gary's (ZL1GA) IC-7600 and Stuart's (ZL2TW) IC-7300 with a range of mostly Yaesu for the VHF/UHF channels. Several other units were shown and shared by participants over the weekend. Neville (ZL2BNE) demonstrated (and modified) some of his extensive home-brewed collection, although in an unguarded moment he was observed operating an Icom without either him or the rig self-destructing!



There were other NZ lighthouses on the air and we quickly made contact with them followed soon after by VKs and later some further afield.



The accommodation at the Cape is very comfortable with the old generator shed now refurbished as the main cottage comprising a large kitchen, living room, bedroom, bathroom and utility room, and large verandah. This became our operational HQ. The "cowshed", "single-man's quarters" and the "weather office" provided

comfortable sleeping quarters for the team.

Rob and Kaye (ZL2KU), having done the hard yards in setting everything up, returned to Blenheim late afternoon.



Meals over the weekend were a highlight, thanks to Ian (ZL2BGL) and Christine, and Gary (ZL1GA) and Carol for the dinners.

Saturday evening saw a series of "show and tells" with various devices and creations with interesting



back-stories being shared by participants. So engrossed in this, we completely overlooked the regular Branch 22 HF net at 20:30.

Sunday was a better day with bright sun but still a wicked wind. With a bit of adjustment to the guys the antennas stood up well and participants who were "off-watch" got out and about exploring the surroundings. Neville, rather heroically, ran the 24km loop back to Marfells Beach then back out via the road. Stuart checked out the long rocky point below the high-water mark that was thrust up by the 2016 earthquake and Greg (ZL2GBX) found a few sleepy seals sheltering from the wind in the tussock. Graeme (ZL1BDS) took the opportunity of a clear sky to do some astro-photography in the evening with some fantastic results.



Throughout the day we operated at least one rig continuously and it was a good opportunity for Link (ZL2CLT), one of newer members, to get some experience before he returned home in the evening.

Overnight the wind switched around and at dawn Monday our verticals were at best "slopers." Bill found that one of the verticals, now almost horizontal at ground level, was giving him good contact into Italy thus proving the benefits of having "wet-feet" at high tide. A quick readjustment and reinstatement of guys was required.

By 10am, with the wind continuing and rain threatening, and with contacts drying up we decided to pack up while it was still dry and were back out on the main road just after midday after a fun and friendly weekend.

CW 1

Total FT8 contacts: 80

Total VHF/UHF contacts: 17 (DMR, DSTAR and National System)



42 of the FT8 contacts were with only 10W! Contacts on this mode/power were mainly with Australia and Asia, but a few also to USA.

Other NZ lighthouse stations that were active were Cape Egmont, Cape Palliser, Tiri Tiri Matangi, and Nugget. We worked all of them as well as 15 Australian LH stations. The furthest LH station worked was N7N on Patos Island north of Seattle. Two other LH stations were worked on FT8 - 9M4LHJ in Malaya and VK6CNL in Western Australia, both on 10W.

Other non-LH stations of note were GW2HFR (Nth Wales), CS2SP (Portugal), F5PFP (France) and VK2VMP (HMAS Vampire, a Destroyer in Darling Harbour, Sydney), all on SSB.

The one CW contact we had was requested but we had to use the mic pressel switch as we didn't have a key on hand!

A big thanks to all participants and to those who loaned equipment, provided meals, organised facilities and general support and encouragement.

Thanks to Greg ZL2GBX and Bill ZL2AYZ for the report and Graeme ZL1BDS and Greg ZL2GBX for the photos.



Look forward to seeing you all at the Christmas lunch, if not before.























